Speed Date - interaction ✨ about entrepreneurship




Entrepreneurial coaching -

Description

Use card games about knowing each other, as question cards, regarding the topic of social entrepreneurship, and invite the participants to face each other, 2 by 2, in a line, being able to hear each other no matter if it is going to be noisy. They will have 2 min to answer each question, and after the 2 minutes, the other person is answering to the same question, and after 4 minutes, the facilitator ring the bell and all the participants that receive 1 question card, they slide the card from left to right and exchange questions, in this way making short conversations about different perspectives on the same topic.



As a conclusion, each pair will change after each 2 minutes the role (listener and speaker), and each 4 minutes they change the questions, exploring different views on the same topic on which is focused the session, the workshop. Till the end of the activity, they will have short interactions with each other, raising awareness regarding the topic, becoming more familiar to each other, focusing on the interaction, becoming more spontaneous and expressing their perspectives.

- 1) Why do young people are willing to open a business before having any experience?
- 2) Why do people usually start planning? Or how do you think they start a business?
- 3) Why do people go to other countries to work? (how is situation in your country?)
- 4) Why do people move for work, from their place they come?
- 5) What factors push people to leave their country in order to open a business?
- 6) Which countries have the best success with entrepreneurial actions?

7) What kind of countries take in the most entrepreneurs?

8) What kind of countries take in the least entrepreneurs?

9) How do countries decide how many people from their country should be allowed to open their own business, and what percentage of them are encouraged to work for others, for state or big companies?

10) Do many people freelancing or becoming entrepreneurs from your country?



Objectives



Needed materials

IceBreaker - Breaking the ice and creating a safe space for a session / workshop. This activity has also the purpose of raising awareness about the topic and knowing each other better.

- Card games



- Or can be used any Definitions about the topic to be splitted in each pair of people, and debate for few minutes about it, and then change the questions from left to right side, to be able that all the participants to taste from more topics, that are going to be explored deeper in the session.
